

Parishioners were encouraged to wear red and many happily donned the bright color which was also reflected in the church's décor.






The 10:00 AM Mass welcomed back the traditions of serving cake and flying kites to celebrate the birth of the church.

**GENERAL SUMMARY:** St. Viator is a vibrant Catholic community dedicated to serving the spiritual, educational, and social needs of our parishioners and students. The Business Manager is a professional administrator reporting to the Pastor. This position is responsible for the day-to-day financial and administrative operations as well as the policies and procedures of the St. Viator Community ensuring efficient and effective management in accordance with the values and principles of our Catholic faith.

#### **ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:**

#### Regular and reliable attendance

#### **Financial Management:**

Preparation and review of QuickBooks accounting of Parish and School financial statements and budget reporting in collaboration with Pastor and Parish Finance Committee.

Supervision and implementation of payroll, records management, accruals, and benefit accounting to include monthly reconciliation of bank accounts.

Oversee all financial transactions, including accounts payable and receivable, payroll, and financial reporting. Monitor cash flow and financial performance, identifying areas for improvement and implementing solutions as needed.

Ensure compliance with all relevant financial regulations and reporting requirements.

Work with parish finance committee, council, school and Archdiocese.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On the weekend of June 9, 2024, we will take up a second collection for the rural Parishes and Missions within our Archdiocese.

This collection is used to help sustain rural parishes that could not otherwise remain open. Many of these parishes are long distances from the neighboring Parish and serve populations that are small and, therefore, unable to maintain ministries and buildings completely on their own. For example, St. Patrick Parish in Tonopah supports the missions of St. Barbara in Round Mountain and Our Lady of Guadalupe in Fish Lake Valley, while Sacred Heart Parish in Ely supports the missions of St. Michael in McGill and Holy Child in Caliente, covering vast areas within our Archdiocese.

These rural Parishes and Missions need our support to provide religious education and evangelization programs for their parishioners. Additionally, they help sustain the pastoral ministry of Priests who travel long distances to offer the sacraments and Sunday Mass for the faithful.

I ask for your generosity and support for these rural Parishes and Missions, as well as your prayers for our sisters and brothers living in the rural regions of the Archdiocese of Las Vegas. Please help keep these Catholic communities alive; without your assistance, the Catholic presence in these areas would cease.

## FAITH & WORSHIP

Jesus asks us a stunning question this week: "How can Satan cast out Satan?" To enter into this question opens up the oftenhidden dynamics of what Jesus has done and is constantly doing. If we're honest, our response to some degree is: "How else can we cast him out? Satan is precisely how we cast out Satan!" But Jesus wants us to see this finally does not work. Here's what I mean.

Satanas names the demonic mechanism by which we render wholeness through accusation. When we face a threat, we seek something to protect us (e.g., more money, social status, security, power, etc.). Rivals inevitably arise for these things and so do tensions. Accusation presents itself. "I'll never be successful unless I get ahead of that guy." "She's already trying to get ahead of me." "That group of immigrants is trying to take our jobs." And so on. The accusation grows into a fear-inducing threat — things will break apart — no, they already are! Hurry! We inflict violence on the victim and — as if by magic — peace For time. Soon ensues. а accusations are required to hold new chaos at bay, until there is no community left at all. This is essentially humankind's sad history in a nutshell.

Jesus' cross and resurrection unmasks this broken system of "casting out Satan by Satan" and ushers in a new one he calls "the Kingdom of God." He reveals that the dynamic of accusation is nothing compared to his power of divine mercy and love. The cross (and not Satan) is the real power to tear down strongholds of sin and cast out Satan. This is why he describes himself as "stronger man who ties up the strong man to plunder his house." This week let's notice the ways we "cast out Satan by Satan," and then refuse to do it anymore. Because in the long run, that divided house cannot stand.

#### In the Family Way

Look here: there is no one more family-oriented than me. I drive a minivan. I wear mom jeans. I wipe unidentified gunk off of kids' faces without a thought.

I'm all about family, but I'm not always a fan of what "family" has come to mean in the modern lexicon. Family values. Family-friendly. Family-oriented. It's usually a synonym for "non-offensive." Soft. Moderate. Nice.

It's all fine, I suppose. But is it genuine? Creating a family, bringing that family physically into the world, was the hardest and most painful thing I ever did. The care and keeping of that family — the teamwork with my spouse, the feeding and watering of the children, the teaching of the writing and the reading the and praying - it's very hardcore. It's not all stuffed animals and peekaboo. It's a mental, spiritual, and physical challenge that daily brings me to my knees.

I'm not even talking exclusively about parenting young children. I'm talking about being part of a family in any way — being a son, being a daughter, being a sister and cousin and uncle. Families are complicated and strange and messy. Sometimes boundaries need to be drawn, or they need to be crossed. Sometimes walls need to be put up or torn down. It's never easy.

But I've never known someone who didn't want to be part of a family, whether that's a blood family or one created by circumstance. And there's a reason Christ creates a family ("Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother") and not a club.

A family is a crucible, yes — but what comes out is so much more beautiful than what went in. For all the effort and even pain that is sometimes involved in a family relationship, there is nothing more fulfilling.

We are part of Christ's family, and what we can expect from that is certainly not a life of simple, clear-cut, undemanding discipleship. We can expect confusion. We can expect discomfort. But we can expect to be perpetually drawn to the heart of one who loves us without hesitation, without condition.

In the end, we're family.


